Washington Internships for Students of Engineering (WISE)

Student sponsored for prestigious Washington, D.C., program

Industry-Specific Awards from Technical Committees

– Mather Scholarship

Up to \$7,500 for sophomore to graduate student interested in cement/concrete (C09) materials technology

– Mather Student Contribution Award

\$1K plus travel to meeting of concrete and concrete aggregates committee (C09) for student who has developed proposed standard or research paper

– Norton Memorial Scholarship Award for Women

\$1K for senior or first-year graduate student interested in physical metallurgy (committee E04) or materials science

– Fatigue/Fracture Student Paper Award

Honor for high quality research papers in fracture, subcritical crack growth, presented at meeting of fatigue/fracture committee (E08)
